3. Which sources and data do we use?

We process personal data that we receive from you as part of the registration for the newsletter.

Relevant personal data are in particular your name and your e-mail address.

4. For what purposes and on what legal basis do we process your data?

We process your personal data in compliance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the new Federal Data Protection Act (BDSG).

a. Based on your consent (Art. 6 para. 1 s. 1 lit. a GDPR).

6 How long will your data be stored?

Your data collected as part of the newsletter subscription will only be processed as long as it is necessary to send the newsletter.

Your personal data is regularly deleted immediately after you unsubscribe from the newsletter.

7. Will your data be transferred to a third country or to an international organization?

Data transfer to countries outside the EU or EEA (so-called third countries) does not take place, with the following exception:

Through the use of Office 365 and related applications, a partial transfer of personal data to the USA takes place as part of the support and hosting services of the "Microsoft Corporation". The contractual processing agreement with Microsoft includes EU standard contractual clauses which, according to Art. 46 para. 2 lit. c GDPR, are appropriate safeguards for the transfer of data to third countries.

8. What data protection rights do you have?

You have the right:

• in accordance with Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR to revoke your consent once given to us at any time. This has the consequence that we will in the future no longer continue the data processing based on this consent,

• in accordance with Art. 15 GDPR, to request information about your personal data processed by us,

in accordance with Art. 16 GDPR, to request without undue delay the rectification of inaccurate or incomplete personal data held by us,

in accordance with Art. 17 GDPR, to request the deletion of your personal data stored by us, unless the processing is necessary for exercising the right to freedom of expression and information, for compliance with a legal obligation, for reasons of public interest or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims,

in accordance with Art. 18 GDPR, to request the restriction of the processing of your personal data, insofar as the accuracy of the data is disputed by you, the processing is unlawful, but you object to its erasure and we no longer need the data, but you need it for the assertion, exercise or defence of legal claims or you have objected to the processing in accordance with Art. 21 GDPR,

in accordance with Art. 20 GDPR, to receive your personal data that you have provided to us in a structured, common and machine-readable format or to request that it be transferred to another controller.

You can revoke your consent to the processing of your personal data within the scope of the newsletter subscription in the future at any time.

A revocation of the newsletter subscription can be done in several ways. On the one hand, by sending a return message to the sender of the newsletter or by e-mail to the newsletter distributor with the appendage "-unsubscribe". Furthermore, a manual unsubscription via the online interface is also possible. Instructions on how to unsubscribe are included in every email newsletter.

You can also assert your rights by informally notifying us in text form.

10. Is there an obligation for you to provide data?

13. Right of complaint

You have the right to lodge a complaint with a data protection supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of personal data concerning you violates the General Data Protection Regulation. 14. Right to object
